In Watson Worshop, I mostly work with repairs, such as sizing up and down rings, fixing and building up chains or bracelets, re-designing and re-doing some parts of jewelry, create some



sketches for unusual pieces of art and, of course, work with golden wedding bands, pendants, earrings finishing up after casting. Every task demands focus and dedication, I spent hours of mastering techniques like soldering, laser welding, finishing details, stone setting learning so, each skill building on the last. Today, I am delighted to work as a jeweler and I do not stop improving myself every day, because there are so many achievements ahead to me.


